CONTENT AREAS COVERED IN THE TEST

READING FLUENCY

FLUENCY INVOLVES READING WITH ACCURACY, APPROPRIATE RATE, AND EXPRESSION. THE TEST EVALUATES KNOWLEDGE OF STRATEGIES TO IMPROVE FLUENCY, THE ROLE OF FLUENCY IN OVERALL READING COMPETENCE, AND METHODS FOR MONITORING FLUENCY PROGRESS.

READING COMPREHENSION

THIS AREA ASSESSES SKILLS RELATED TO UNDERSTANDING AND INTERPRETING TEXT. IT INCLUDES STRATEGIES FOR TEACHING COMPREHENSION, TYPES OF COMPREHENSION QUESTIONS, TEXT STRUCTURES, AND THE INTEGRATION OF READING WITH CRITICAL THINKING SKILLS.

TEST FORMAT AND QUESTION TYPES
