THIN RIP BLADES

ALWAYS USE PUSH STICKS OR PUSH BLOCKS TO GUIDE THIN STOCK THROUGH THE BLADE, KEEPING HANDS AT A SAFE DISTANCE. EMPLOY FEATHERBOARDS TO MAINTAIN LATERAL PRESSURE AND PREVENT THE WOOD FROM SHIFTING. THESE TOOLS NOT ONLY ENHANCE SAFETY BUT ALSO IMPROVE CUT ACCURACY.

BLADE SELECTION AND SETUP

WORK ENVIRONMENT

KEEP THE WORK AREA CLEAN AND WELL-LIT. CLEAR AWAY SCRAP PIECES IMMEDIATELY AND ENSURE THE FLOOR IS FREE OF SLIP HAZARDS. A STABLE, CLUTTER-FREE WORKSPACE REDUCES ACCIDENTS AND IMPROVES FOCUS DURING THIN RIP OPERATIONS.

MAINTENANCE AND CARE OF TOOLS

PROPER MAINTENANCE OF SAWS, BLADES, AND ACCESSORIES EXTENDS THEIR LIFESPAN AND ENSURES CONSISTENT PERFORMANCE WHEN RIPPING THIN WOOD.
